Experiences at Red Cross's Hurricane Harvey's Preparations Center

Michael Nolan, KD5MLD, called for volunteers on August 27th to assist Red Cross in Baton Rouge with the processing of approximately 1,000 volunteers coming to Baton Rouge for training to be deployed to the flooded areas in Texas. Steve Irving, WA5FKF, was the Disaster Services Technology (DST) Lead for Red Cross.

Robin Hudson, KK5RH, Dan Lott, KF5TQN, Mary Irving, KF5DSR, and Jon Reise, WA9JBR, arrived shortly after Michaels' request while Thornton Cofield, K5HLC, did not join them until Wednesday, August 30. Being a new Red Cross volunteer I found the organizational structure somewhat confusing, but I did know several volunteers and the second I told them I was with the DST section they assumed I knew what I was doing. That was somewhat a relief because I didn't. During Red Cross's 9am briefing sessions and after talking with Steve I realized that Baton Rouge was a staging area for materials and people assigned to Texas. I believe this was the first time Baton Rouge served in this function so much of work flow pattern was unfamiliar.

Our DST duties as I understood them were to resolve any communication issues that arose which included radio communications on those Emergency Resource Vehicles (ERVs) leaving for Texas. All the electronics had to function, and the drivers had to know how to use their radios and the frequency they were assigned. Since Baton Rouge was designated a staging area for Texas, the ERVs were assigned a check list for vehicle operability, communications functionality, and then outfitted with water, snacks, and other items to help sustain the displaced population affected by Hurricane Harvey in Texas.

It turned out that our duties during the 3 days I was with the group did not involve much airwave communications as completing the written communication check list required for each ERV, and resolving any ERV communication issues which included public address broadcast functions before the ERV was released for duty. We checked whether the radio worked, condition of the antenna, SWR, radio frequency settings, cable placement related to safety concerns, etc. on each ERV.

Red Cross Preparations Continued -

Most, if not all of the transceivers were commercial Vertex VX-6000 radios, and we did replace at least one radio. Several PA horns mounted in or below the ERV bumper were replaced as well as several antenna whips and antenna ball mountings due to excessive rust, corrosion, and bad insulators. SWR problems were extremely rare and were resolved by replacing the antenna. We also showed several new drivers how to operate their radio. Everyone seemed to enjoy their assignments and thought it was a great learning experience.
