HF Radio Training Session at W5KID Aboard USS Kidd

On Saturday February 12, 2022, three of our newer club members attended a training session about HF radio at our W5K-ID club station. Jon Reise (WA9JBR) and John Krupsky (WA5MLF) arranged two 2-hour sessions to provide some experience with HF radio operations.

Jon and John described the station's radio components and their interconnections, including the antenna system and the computer that is used for logging and digital mode contacts. The basics of voice and digital operation on the HF bands were discussed and demonstrated, followed by supervision of each student in making radio contacts.





Joe Roppolo (K5ROP) attended the morning session (10:00 am to noon). After the orientation session, Joe enjoyed an extended voice conversation with one of Jon's friends in the Chicago area. Joe also observed several FT8 contacts made by Jon.

After their orientation session, they enjoyed a bunch of quick voice contacts as the receiving end of a typical W5KID pile-up. All three participants are scheduled for exams to upgrade their licenses.





All the day's contacts were on the 20 m band. 42 voice contacts spanned the following 18 states: FL, IA, IL, IN, KS, KY, MD, ME, MI, MO, NC, NH, NY, OH, PA, TN, WI, WV. The North Carolina contact with AE4WX was from the Battleship North Carolina. Our 7 FT8 contacts included: AZ, IL, MA, MN, NM, OH and Puerto Rico.

We greatly appreciate the computer and widescreen monitor that Dan Lott (KF5TQN) donated to our club for use at the USS KIDD. They form a significant upgrade to the computing components that served the club for many years to log our contacts. The new computer continues the logging function and performs very well in running digital mode programs. We also greatly appreciate the Icom IC7300 transceiver and the Acom 600S linear amplifier donated by Tom Harrell (KE5LVQ). These have greatly enhanced our station's performance.

We are glad that everyone enjoyed the session at the USS KIDD and look forward to future sessions like this one for other members who have not yet had the opportunity to operate on the HF bands. Satisfactory contacts were made using SSB, FT4, FT8. and CW. Everything worked as expected. Leon, N5LAZ requested permission to operate on the USS KIDD and either John or Jon will work out arrangements with Leo. February 12 was the date agreed upon by Jon and John to offer a training session on using the equipment on the KIDD as well as an introduction to operating protocol. Joe Roppolo and Eric Herrmann, Jr. expressed interest in this arrangement although it is open to several more people.



Minutes approval from 11/2/2021: Todd moved that the minutes be accepted, seconded by Jerry and accepted.

Treasurer Report- Jerry reported \$10,404.00 in the bank as of 12/31/2021.

Committee Reports:

Education-Dan is waiting to hear from ARRL. Steve Irving is working with Dan to access Red Cross facilities for doing a series of Ham Cram classes. Dan is also looking at conducting a Tech class in the Spring or Fall with a General class in the Summer. Dan will also check with the Main Baton Rouge Library on using the Tech room.

Equipment-Jerry has an ICOM 730 transceiver.

PIO/Outreach /Mbr-Thornton- As of 12/31/2021 We had 101 members. Fourteen are comp members. We also had the photo of BRARC Officers and Directors published in the Community section of "The Advocate" Sunday, Jan. 2, 2022 on page 3D.

EMCOM-No Report

Repeater-Brook reported that everything seems to be working and no problems were reported.

USS Kidd Club- John Krupsky and Jon setup the ICOM 7300 and the ACOM amp on the USS KIDD. The 7300 and the amp were tested at 300 watts and everything functioned within specifications. Dan donated a computer to use on the KIDD and it is also setup and was tested. The licensed copy of the N3FJP logging software program is owned by Dana Browne who offered to give us the software in exchange for a 1 year membership in BRARC. A motion to approve the license transfer of the N3FJP software from Dana Browne to BRARC in exchange for a 1 year membership in BRARC was made by Dan, seconded by Don, and unanimously approved by a show of hands.

The use of the ACOM amp. on Field Day and other special occasions was discussed while noting that to use the full power of 600watts we would have to upgrade the antenna turner to handle the increased wattage.

VE Team-Jon/Todd-VE Session Goodwood Library on 12/11/21 10:00 AM: Jon noted that the testing was successful with 6 candidates all passing their selected license certifications. Jon also noted that 4 testing dates for 2022 were already scheduled and the Baton Rouge Main Library has already recorded our reservations for rooms for the dates of Mar. 5, June 4, Sept. 3, and Dec. 3, 2022.

Elmer also requested help on Saturday Jan. 29 with AARC's Winter Field Day. He specifically is asking for VE's for to aid in testing and Elmers who would like to aid in giving presentations for "Boot Camp for Hams". For Further information please see their website www.k5arc.org

Old Business

2021 BRARC Christmas Dinner December 4th. **Big Mike's Sports Bar and Grill in Denham Springs:** Todd reported that with 40 people present he considered the Christmas Dinner a success with everyone seeming to had a good time and the food was great.

Beam, Rotor – Observatory – Repair/replace rotor: The main discussion centered around how to remove the rotor. Todd reported that Jeremy (with the Fire Dept) does not have access to a bucket truck. Todd said that he would talk to his brother-in-law about possibly renting a bucket truck. Jerry made a quick call and noted that a bucket truck (or lift) rents for about \$250 a day. Todd and Dan agreed to take the lead on resolving this issue.

New Business-

Inventory- Bill- Since I sent out my email last week, I have received 4 responses.

There is a Heathkit Tube Tester which will be returned at our January meeting. We will need a volunteer to take this task to completion. Once we know what we have and where it is located the upkeep of this information should be minimal.

We do have a lockable cabinet at Red Cross which is approx. 7 ft. tall. Jon and Steve Irving will meet at Red Cross this Thursday to inventory what is in the cabinet. Jon mentioned he will take a photo of the open cabinet.

Language in the Bylaws- There is somewhat conflicting guidance as to when elected officers and board members assume their duties. Thornton reported that there is no conflict.

In regards to the LANGUAGE IN THE BYLAWS concerning conflicting guidance—There is really no conflict in the wording concerning when the newly elected BRARC Board assumes their duties. The wording concerning when the new Board members assume their duties is stated slightly different in the third to the last sentence under ARTICLE IX. ELECTIONS- Section 1 as compared to when the newly elected BRARC Board assumes their duties under ARTICLE IX. ELECTIONS- Section 5.

However, both sections complement one another.

Section 1 simply states that the Board of BRARC will expire in the year which the election is held.

Section 5 states the Officers and Directors will assume office on January 1 of the year following their election.

Removal of the antenna on the USS KIDD Museum Building:

John Krupsky spoke with Tim Nesbitt with the Museum and Tim said that the Museum has a part-time maintenance worker who can help with removing the roof top antenna. John Krupsky will take the lead on this project.

John Krupsky – WA5MLF:

John noted that he recently added 3 new operating days for operating from the USS KIDD. We now have 10 days of radio operating from the USS KIDD for our members.

BRARC Insurance:

Jerry noted that he wrote a check for insurance to Ham Radio Insurance on March 9, 2021. He will prepare payment for insurance this year while Bill will call Russ London about obtaining liability insurance for the club.

BRARC Taxes 2021:

Jerry will begin collecting everything for filing BRARC taxes as a 501©3 private corporation.

Astronomy Day – Observatory May 7, 2022:

Chris Kersey requested that BRARC setup radio operations from 4pm-8pm at the Observatory on Astronomy Day. Dan stated that he will participate. Everyone thought it was a good idea.

Microsoft 365 Non-Profit Donation Program:

Bert introduced the Microsoft 360 web based program that is offered without cost to NGOs such as BRARC. Most of Microsoft programs such as Word, Excel, PowerPoint, etc. are included such as One Drive which is very similar to Drop Box. Dan commented that the Microsoft Product is very similar to the Google web based product which he introduced to BRARC several years ago. Bert was asked to give a short presentation on the Microsoft Product to the Board next month.
