Rules

§97.313 Transmitter power standards.

(a) An amateur station must use the minimum transmitter power necessary to carry out the desired communications.

§97.119 Station identification.

(a) Each amateur station... must transmit its assigned call sign on its transmitting channel at the end of each communication, and at least every 10 minutes during a communication, for the purpose of clearly making the source of the transmissions from the station known to those receiving the transmissions. No station may transmit unidentified communications or signals...

§97.113 Prohibited transmissions.

(a)(4) Music using a phone emission except as specifically provided elsewhere...; obscene or indecent words or language...

LANGUAGE
