Highland Road Park Observatory Saturday, 25 June from 2:00 pm to 10:00 pm

The Baton Rouge Amateur Radio Club will take part in an exciting nationwide emergency exercise. Temporary stations will be set up at HRPO as BRARC joins similar clubs across the continent in an exciting emergency exercise. Some clubs use strictly battery power and solar power. Some clubs use low power outputs (five watts or less) to make contact with other stations all over North America.

Field Day is a twenty-four-hour endurance session of skill and suspense. How many North American sections can the club members contact before time runs out? HRPO patrons will only be allowed on the property from 2:00 pm to 10:00 pm on Saturday, 25 June.

The entire eight hours there will be...

- A display of modern and vintage amateur radio equipment.
- An area to practice Morse code.
- A GOTA station allowing non-licensed visitors to contact another state
- From 3:30 pm to 5:30 pm solar viewing will take place.
- From 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm, the Train Like an Astronaut course will be open.
- Sometime during the event, the operators may attempt to contact the International Space Station.

The Amateur Radio Service, founded decades ago, is the original “social medium!” Half-a-million licensed hams—including high schoolers, college kids, parents and grandparents—communicate day after day from coast to coast.

What can people do in the Amateur Radio Service?

- Talk around the world without the Internet or cell phones.
- Send a message to another country using less electricity than a nightlight.
- Transmit your communication in code—Morse code!
- Speak to astronauts on the International Space Station.

What can adults do in the Amateur Radio Service?

- Earn various awards.
- Have more peace of mind knowing that, unlike the internet, federal law mandates sending identifying information during any communication.
- Increase the chances of their families having contact with the outside world during an emergency, simply by connecting radio equipment to a car battery.
- Collect weather and flight data from a launched balloon.

What can kids do in the Amateur Radio Service?

- Work toward specialized merit badges and patches.
- Steer radio-controlled cars and airplanes, or control robots, using ham-only frequencies.
- Keep a hand-held remote transceiver during camping trips.

Come learn more about amateur, or “ham,” radio at this fantastic annual event. Remember, if you like what you see at Field Day there will be plenty of friendly “hams” around to tell you exactly what you need to do to obtain your own amateur radio license and start transmitting!

BRARC History

1941-1946

All activities moved to the Naval Reserve Headquarters in early 1941. After the start of WWII, Congress suspended all amateur radio operations and many of the younger hams were called to active duty as radio operators. In June 1942, at the insistence of the American Radio Relay League, the US government created the War Emergency Radio Service (WERS) WERS was a precursor to the civil defense and Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES) groups and it which would remain active through 1945. WERS provided communications in connection with air raid protection, and communications during times of natural disaster. WERS licenses were given to communities and not individuals.

In March of 1941, BRARC wrote to the ARRL and provided the following update:

Four of the club members were called to active duty and a fifth was expected to be called within days. Seven active members were reported. No meetings were held in the previous three months.

After the War ended many veteran hams returned to Baton Rouge. The re-organized club first met at LSU. A number of faculty and students also regularly attended the club meetings. Later, the club moved its meeting place to the radio shop of Les Wilson (W5MZA) on St. Louis Street not far from the present location of the River Center. Some of the members included: Al Hayes (W5MHZ), George Hidalgo (W5DGB), George Perry (W5LVX), Stan Preston (W5GIX), Vince Rosso (W5KC), Jack Whitaker (W5HEZ)

ARES® Activated in Oklahoma for Tornado Clean-Up Communications

To help with emergency communications support following an outbreak of tornadoes that hit this past week, the Oklahoma Department of Emergency of Management and Homeland Security requested support from the Oklahoma Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®).

During the first week of May, 12 tornadoes touched down in the central and eastern parts of Oklahoma. The tornado that struck Seminole, Oklahoma, on Wednesday, May 4, left EF2 damage, according to the National Weather Service. That tornado was a mile wide, and its path totaled 31 miles.

The request for amateur radio emergency communications support from the Oklahoma ARES was made on Thursday, May 5, 2022. ARES was activated on Saturday May 7, 2022. Seven amateur radio operators were active, providing voice communications between chainsaw and debris removal teams from their base at Seminole State College's volunteer center.

ARRL Oklahoma Section Emergency Coordinator Mark Conklin, N7XYO, said the clean-up crews worked quickly, and ARES was needed for 8 hours until cellular and wired communications were restored.

There were no deaths or injuries during the tornado outbreak, but clean up continues.

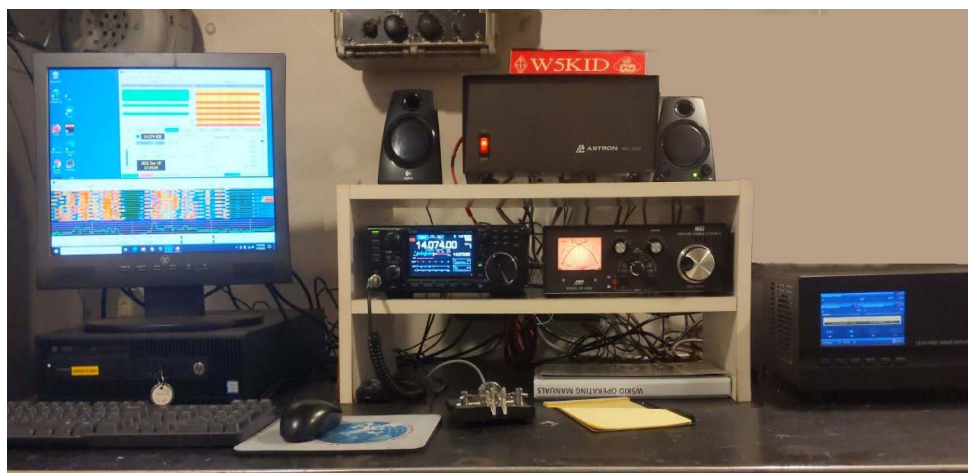

USS Kidd Club- Jon Reise was absent. John Krupsky (WA5MLF) submitted a brief summary of the USS Kidd operating event commemorating Vietnam Veterans Memorial Day to the board via E-mail..

VE Team-Todd (AB5TH) mentioned that there was a club VE session on March 5th at The Goodwood Library. The next VE session will be held on Saturday June 4

OLD BUSINESS

Beam, Rotor – Observatory – Todd (AB5TH) reported that LSU will replace the rotor and feedline at the Observatory. No date has been decided for this project. LSU will not allow remote access to their internet connection at the Observatory for the club to set up a remote HF club station so Dan (KF5TQN) offered to look into the cost of remote Internet access via microwave.

BRARC Insurance- Bill (KE5TA) reported that the club liability insurance is paid for 2022. We can now look for a climate controlled storage unit to store club equipment,

BRARC Taxes 2021-Jerry (AG5AY) noted that due to the complexity of filing the Club's taxes on account of our 501pf status, he recommended to the board that the club hire a CPA to prepare the taxes like we did last year. Jerry made a motion for this and Dan (KF5TQN) seconded the motion and the motion carried. Jerry estimated that the cost to prepare the taxes will be approximately \$250 not to exceed \$300.

Astronomy Day – Observatory May 7, 2022: - Jerry (AG5AY) will not be able to serve as contact person for Astronomy Day this year. Jon Reise (WA9JBR) and Dana Browne (AD5VC) have agreed to work the club booth for this year and they have already met and are planning the event.

Microsoft 365 Non-Profit Donation Program: Bert (K5AJL) will present a short demonstration of the Microsoft 365 Non-profit Donation Program at the October 2022 club meeting.

Donated Air conditioner USS Kidd-Bill (KE5TA) donated a 5000 btu window air conditioning unit to the USS Kidd for use in the radio room aboard the USS Kidd. John Krupsky noted that the manufacturer of the air-conditioner recommends using a 15 amp circuit breaker. He is looking into upgrading the existing 10 amp breaker to a 15 amp circuit breaker.

Committee Reports:

Education-Dan reported that the Main Library does not want us to use the lab room for training. He did not know why. Dan did report that he has the ARRL links to acquire the training material. His plan is to setup a couple of weekends to do intense cram sessions for passing the Technician class exam, perhaps the next weekend for the General class exam, and perhaps another weekend for the Extra class exam. 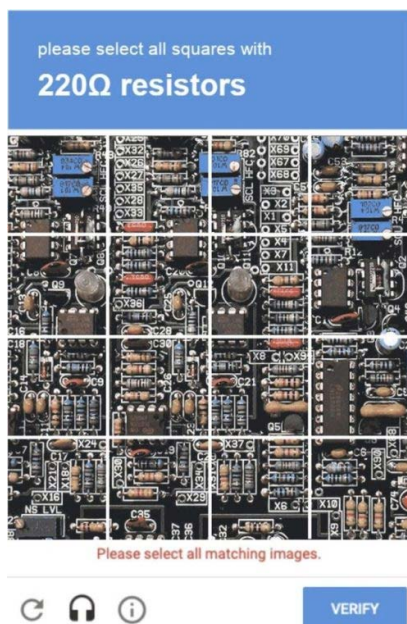
